Map 123

A revised version of Map 106, Map 123 incorporates changes requested at the 8/27/2019 Special Meeting. The eastern boundary between Districts 3 and 5 has been aligned to Cannon Street, the Latino population in District increased to 40% of eligible voting population, and the general shapes of the districts retained.

Map 124

A revised version of Map 110, Map 124 incorporates changes requested at the 8/27/2019 Special Meeting. Both 124 and 125 are modifications of Map 110, using the 55 Freeway as a hard boundary, dividing Old Towne in three districts, and increasing the Latino population in D1 to about 40%. This version allows two districts to cross the 55 Freeway (Districts 2 & 3), because it keeps District 2 entirely south of Chapman.

Map 125

A revised version of Map 110, Map 125 incorporates changes requested at the 8/27/2019 Special Meeting. Both 124 and 125 are modifications of Map 110, using the 55 Freeway as a hard boundary, dividing Old Towne in two districts, and increasing the Latino population in D1 to about 40%. This This version only allows one district, D2, to cross the 55 Freeway, which decreases the split of Old Towne from 3 to 2 districts (District 1 no longer in Old Towne).

Map 126

A revised version of Map 122, Map 126 incorporates changes requested at the 8/27/2019 Special Meeting. This version unites the Presidential Tract D3 and East Orange Plan in D6. To maintain population balance and avoid large changes, Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4 remain the same.

Map 127 - Not population-balanced

Map drawn with a district on one side of the train tracks, two districts between the train tracks and freeway, two districts in the hills of Orange, and a district between it all.

Map 128

Modified 122 plan. District 3 southern boundary is moved to Collins up to Wanda which keeps the Presidential Tract as one district. Presidential Tract is bounded by 55 Fwy, Collins, Wanda, and Katella. Boundary between Districts 3 and 6 moved to Serrano. Homes on both sides of Santiago Creek and below Serrano share common concerns with development of creek area and should be in one district. Homes below Serrano are older and one tract while homes above Serrano are often less than 15 yrs old. Please contact me for supporting documentation for statements and if you have questions.

This is a modified version of Map 106 in the west and Map 122 in the east. I think it does a much better job at keeping communities of interest together.

Map 133

Map 134

A more extensive modification of Map 122 & Map 126, this map incorporates concerns about keeping the Cypress Street Barrio intact, but moves it to District 1 entirely. This creates the only plurality Latino seat by eligible voting population (CVAP) in any population-balanced map. In addition, it incorporates comments about keeping the East Orange Tract and Presidential Tract intact.
